Crans is full professor at Loyola Marymount University. She works in algebraic topology, knot theory, and algebra, and has also written about the connections between mathematics and music. Crans is instrumental in community building through her roles as the Associate Director of Project NExT, and Associate Director of Diversity and Education at MSRI. She won an MAA Henry L. Alder Award (2011),

and an MAA Merten M. Hasse Award (2011), and was an MAA Distinguished Lecturer (2014). Her mentoring activities include PATHWAYS presentations for K-12 students in LA and teaching at summer mathematics programs for women undergraduates. Crans is also an AWM Fellow (2020).
