

Bhama Srinivasan (b. 1935)

Srinivasan is from India and did her doctoral work in England. Her career has mostly been at Clark University (Worcester) and the University of Illinois at Chicago. She specializes in the representation theory of finite groups, and has supervised five PhDs, two of them by women. Srinivasan has contributed extensive journal editorial service.

During her term as President of the AWM (1981–1983), the association organized its first international conference, the Noether Symposium. Srinivasan has also had stints at the Institute for Advanced Study (1977), and the Mathematical Sciences Research Institute (1990). She gave the AWM Noether Lecture (1990), and is both an AMS Fellow (2012) and an AWM Fellow (2017).
