

Concha Gómez (b. mid 1900s)

Gómez is professor of mathematics at Diablo Valley College, having previously taught at Middlebury College, the University of Wisconsin-Madison and San Francisco State University. While in grad school at UC-Berkeley, she co-founded the Noetherian Ring, a group for gender minorities in math. At Madison, she directed the Emerging Scholars program, which promotes the retention of minority

STEM students. She left for California after Wisconsin banned both same-sex marriage and civil unions in the mid-2000s. At Diablo Valley College, Gómez teaches courses utilizing student-centered and collaborative learning techniques. One of her initiatives there is an interdisciplinary network of Latinx professors who support Latinx students. Gomez lives with Multiple Sclerosis.
