

Lai-Sang Young (b. 1952)

Young is from Hong Kong, and was educated in the US. She is the Henry & Lucy Moses Professor of Science at NYU's Courant Institute of Mathematical Sciences. Her interests are in ergodic properties of dynamical systems, computational modeling, and theoretical neuroscience. She has supervised twelve PhDs, three of them by women. Young's awards include a Sloan Fellowship (1985–86), the AMS's Ruth Lyttle Satter Prize (1993), and a

Guggenheim Fellowship (1997–98). She has given two invited talks at the International Congress of Mathematicians (1994, 2018), and been elected a Fellow of the AAAS (2004). Young is now a member of the National Academy of Sciences (2020).
