



Trachette Jackson

(b.1972)

Jackson is full professor at the University of Michigan, where she has spent most of her career. She is also co-director of the Mathematics Biology Research Group and Director of Marjorie Lee Browne Bridge Program there, which prepares masters students for PhD-level work. Jackson's research focuses on mathematical oncology.

She has (co)authored nearly 50 publications, and serves as senior editor for *Cancer Research*. Jackson was the second Black American woman to become a Sloan Fellow in mathematics (2003). She received the James S. McDonnell 21st Century Scientist Award (2005), the Blackwell-Tapia Prize (2010), and is a fellow of the AWM (2017).
