

Deborah Hughes Hallett (b. 1944)

Deborah Hughes Hallett graduated from the University of Cambridge (1966, 1970). She is now Professor of Mathematics at the University of Arizona and Adjunct Professor of Public Policy at Harvard University, having previously taught mathe-Harvard University matics at (1975–1998). She co-organized the Calculus Consortium based at Harvard University to reimagine calculus curricula, and is lead co-author on a calculus textbook used at over 500 institutions. Hughes Hallett

co-chaired the International Conference on the Teaching of Mathematics (1998, 2002, 2006). She received the AWM Louise Hay Award (1998), the MAA Haimo Award (2005), and the AMS Award for Impact on the Teaching and Learning of Mathematics (2022).
