

Fern Hunt (b. 1948)

Fern Hunt was born in New York City in 1948 and earned her PhD from the Courant Institute at NYU in 1978. She was on faculty at Howard University for 15 years while simultaneously working in industry for much of that time. Hunt is a research mathematician at the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST) with interests in bioinformatics, ergodic

theory, probability, and information theory. She was an instructor at the inaugural EDGE program (1998). She won the prestigious Arthur S. Flemming Award for federal employees (2000), gave the AWM-MAA Etta Z. Falconer Lecture (2005), and was named a Fellow of the AMS (2019) and the AWM (2020).
