Julia Maria Aguirre earned her BA in Psychology from the University of California, Berkeley in 1989, her MA in Education from the University of Chicago in 1993, and her PhD in Education from the University of California, Berkeley in 2002. She is Associate Professor of Education at the University of Washington, Tacoma. Aguirre's research is in helping educators provide accessible, relevant mathematics education, bridging gaps across back-

grounds, cultures, languages, beliefs, and practice. She is co-Principal Investigator on the NSF grant "Teachers Empowered to Advance CHange in Mathematics" (TEACH Math), the co-author of the highly cited 2013 book *The Impact of Identity in K–8 mathematics: Rethinking equity-based practices*, and the author or co-author of eight book chapters.

This poster is part of the EvenQuads project, which combines innovative mathematical card games with learning about amazing women mathematicians. The project celebrates the 50th anniversary of the Association for Women in Mathematics.
