(b. 1970s)

Ramanan was awarded her applied mathematics PhD in 1998 from Brown University. She is currently a named Professor and the Associate Chair of ICERM at Brown University. Mathematically, Ramanan's interests are in probability theory, stochastic processes, and their applications to operations research, engineering, statistical physics, and neuroscience. She founded a math outreach group at Brown called the Math CoOp and SEAM (Social

Equity and Applied Mathematics) seminar. Ramanan has won the INFORMS Erlang Prize (2006), the IMS Medallion (2015), a Guggenheim Fellowship (2020), and the Vannevar Bush Faculty Fellowship (2021). She is a fellow of the IMS (2013), the AMS (2018), INFORMS (2018), the AAAS (2019), SIAM (2020), and the AAA&S (2021).
