Margaret Bayer earned her PhD in mathematics from Cornell in 1983 and has been at the University of Kansas since 1988, where she holds the rank of professor. Her research in the combinatorics and geometry of polytopes has been supported through numerous grants and funded research visits. Bayer was recognized for her teaching by three different University of Kansas offices in three different decades. She was a Sigma Xi Distinguished Lecturer in 1998–1999. She has long been the Book Reviews Editor

for the Association for Women in Mathematics (AWM) Newsletter, for which she received a 2013 AWM Service Award. In 2020 she was named an AWM Fellow and also elected to the KU Women's Hall of Fame.
