

María Angélica Cueto (b. 1981)

María Angélica Cueto grew up in Buenos Aires, Argentina. She earned her PhD from the University of California, Berkeley in 2010, completed an NSF postdoc at Columbia University and had two postdoctoral fellowships in Europe, and now is an Associate Professor at The Ohio State University. Her primary research field is tropical geometry. Cueto has co-organized numerous national and international meetings, including PEAK workshops in Austria (2013, 2017),

three SIAM minisymposia on Tropical Geometry, and the Bi-annual Algebraic and Tropical Meetings of Brown and YaLE (BATMOBYLE). She has received two NSF Standard Grants and funding from the Collaborate@ICERM Program, the Research in Pairs Program at Oberwolfach, the CIB in Switzerland, and CIRM in France.
