

Moon Duchin (b. late 1970s)

Moon Duchin earned a mathematics PhD from the University of Chicago (2005) and is currently Associate Professor of Mathematics at Tufts University, a founder of their Science, Technology, and Society Program, and leads the Metric Geometry and Gerrymandering Group (MGGG) Redistricting lab. Duchin was a principal co-author of an Amicus Brief cited by the US Supreme Court and a consulting expert for congressional redistrict-

ing efforts in Pennsylvania. Duchin received an NSF CAREER grant (2013–2018), is an AMS Fellow (2017), Guggenheim Fellow (2018), and Radcliffe Fellow (2018), has served on the board of Spectra (2017–2022), and served on the AMS committees for human rights of mathematicians (2016–2019) and science policy (2020–2023).
