(b. 1970s)



Shelly Harvey earned a PhD from Rice University in 2002, then continued research in topology and geometry through NSF postdocs at the University of California, San Diego (2002–2003) and MIT (2003–2005). Harvey is currently Professor of Mathematics at Rice University working in low-dimensional topology. Harvey has been awarded Sloan Foundation (2006) and Simons Foundation (2014) fellowships, and a 2014–2019 NSF

grant for Building Communities in the Mathematical Sciences initiatives at Rice University. Harvey was elected a Fellow of the AMS (2013). Harvey serves as faculty sponsor for the Rice AWM student chapter and for Rice's Queer Graduate Student Association, and is an editor for the *Proceedings of the AMS* (2020–2024).
