

Guide to QUBES Databases

The annotated image below explains functionalities of Databases constructed on the QUBESHub.

- Download database as csv file.** (Download button)
- Enter/exit full screen view.** (Fullscreen button)
- Return the full dataset by clearing applied filters and searches.** (Clear Filters button)
- Apply/remove text wrapping. "No-wrap" forces each cell to one line of text only.** (No-Wrap button)
- Control how many entries you see per page.** (Show 5 entries dropdown)
- Jump to different pages of the database.** (Page navigation buttons: First, Previous, 1, 2, 3, Next, Last)
- Search all fields for keywords, results appearing as you type.** (Search input field)
- Clicking on column headings provides a description in a popup window.** (Arrows on column headers)
- Clicking arrows on headings sort database A → Z and Z → A, based on content in specified column.** (Arrows on column headers)
- Clicking in the search box provides a drop-down list of all content. It also allows you to search the content only in this column, results appearing as you type.** (Search input field)
- Clicking linked text will take you to a new page.** (Read more links in the description column)
