

1. Biographical information about the scientist

Note: you can ask the scientist to provide this information to you prior to the interview so that you can create a short biography to make better use of limited interview time. You may also want to consult the scientist as to which identities they are comfortable sharing and discussing in this venue.

1. What is your name?
 2. What is your current position?
 3. Where do you currently work?
 4. What is your current field within science/what is your current research topic?
 5. Where did you go to school (undergraduate; graduate; etc.)
 6. What are your pronouns?

2. Where did you grow up, and tell me what it was like growing up there.
 3. What is a typical day like for you?
 4. What kinds of scientific questions interest you the most?
 5. When and how did you know you wanted to be a scientist?
 6. Tell me about a moment when you felt like you really belonged in the field of science.
 7. What is it like being a [intersectional identities] scientist?

Note: This question is very flexible depending on what the interviewee wants to disclose and allows the scientist the opportunity to choose which intersection(s) they are comfortable in discussing.
